

Mp3Doctor PRO Releases New Standardizing Algorithm

The frequent drops in quality between mp3 files finally have a definitive solution.

March 18, 2009 (FPRC) -- Mp3Doctor PRO developers have announced a new system that is able to standardize the quality of all mp3 files. With this system, users can maintain a standard quality in all mp3s from its collection, even if the user has thousands of mp3 files.

The well-known company CNET has also made available to the general public the option of downloading directly from their own servers.

It is expected that in these early weeks the number of downloads exceeds 100 thousand and by the end of the year is expected to have exceeded one million downloads. All this according to the version that the company has disclosed in its website.
