

## **Choosy Learner To Combat Northern Irelands ‘Multiple Driving Test Fails’**

*Shocking Government statistics reveal the number of driving tests failed for the fifth time, therefore showing, more clearly than ever, the need for learners to be fully prepared for a driving test. One company has taken this as a challenge!*

December 17, 2009 (FPRC) -- Following the recent revelations from the Environment Minister, Edwin Poots, who announced that recent statistics for learner drivers failing their driving test included the fact that a shocking 1,981 candidates taking their driving test last year had failed their driving test at least 5 times!

The statistics also included the fact that nearly 15,000 had failed their driving test when attempting it for the first time.
