

Should Alcohol be Sold on Sundays in Georgia? Georgia Senate Bill 10.

The purpose of the survey is to gain insight into public opinion and to stimulate productive debate and discussion about the bill. Results will be sent directly to Governor Nathan Deal and the Senate.

February 18, 2011 (FPRC) -- On February 2, 2011, the Georgia Senate State and Local Governmental Operations Committee approved a bill that proposes to allow the selling of alcohol by retailers on Sundays in the state of Georgia. Georgia is one of three states to ban retail alcohol sales on Sunday, however, beer, wine and liquor purchases are welcomed at most bars and restaurants. Former Governor Sunny Purdue had opposed alcohol sales on Sunday, however, new Governor Nathan Deal believes that the decision should be left to the people of the community. If the bill is passed and signed by Governor Deal, residents will have the right to vote on this issue by the fall.
